WHAT TO EXPECT FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP - Our Return to Church Plan has been developed by guidance from the CDC and State health department guidelines, along with feedback from church council, our congregation, First Church and UCC leadership, and guidance from Dr. Mike.

Everyone's health and safety is our top concern and we ask that you worship virtually and **stay home if you are:**

- Experiencing any cold/flu/Covid symptoms, or
- Uncomfortable returning to church at this time.

For everyone planning to attend in person, we've outlined what to expect below:

1. Wear your Mask. We ask that everyone please wear a mask while in the church building and during worship. If you forget your mask or don't have one that day, a mask will be provided.
2. Socially Distanced Seating. Ushers will show worshipers to designated seats for the day's service to ensure we can keep families together and provide space between pews.
3. Hand Sanitizer. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the church and it's a best practice to sanitize your hands upon entering and exiting the building.

4. Single-Use Bulletins. We will provide bulletins and we ask that you don't share your bulletin with others. We'll have stations to collect/recycle bulletins as you exit the sanctuary.
5. Ventilation Enhancements and Open Doors. We will adjust the ventilation in the sanctuary and plan to keep the Fourth Street doors open to maximize fresh air flow throughout the sanctuary. Doors will be held/propped open upon entering/exiting the building to minimize the need to touch surfaces.

If you would like to respond to the call to worship and prayers, please plan to use a (provided) N95 mask. *An usher can assist you.*

ATTENTION ALL SOUP LOVERS!! This is your lucky month! Each Sunday in November (ending the 22nd), we will be holding soup sales. WITTING TREE CEREMONY - Join us next Sunday at 10:30 a.m. for a time of remembrance with a "Witting Tree" ceremony. More than 20 known Witting Tree ceremonies are being offered in November, among faith communities and organizations from Bucks and Montgomery Counties. These ceremonies will include the hanging of twenty-two sets of dog tags on "Witting Trees" in a public remembrance of the estimated twenty-two veterans who take their lives by suicide every day. The Witting Tree

originally started five years ago, as far as we know, at Eastern Mennonite University by a young graduate student US Navy veteran, Michael McAndrew. *Witting -- done in full awareness or consciousness; deliberate--(of a person) conscious or aware of the full facts of a situation.* We invite you to share this information to anyone who would like to attend this ceremony.
